Children's Books

- Adler, David A. A Picture Book of Helen Keller. (PZ 10 .A2615 Phe 1990)
Briefly relates the life of Helen Keller, who was both deaf and blind.
- Bergman, Thomas. Finding a Common Language: Children Living With Deafness.
(PZ 10 .B472 Fi 1989) Follows the activities of a 6-year-old Swedish girl as she attends a nursery school for the deaf.
- Booth, Barbara. Mandy. (PZ 7 .B6463 Ma 1991)
A deaf girl risks going out into the scary night during an impending storm to look for her beloved grandmother's lost pin.
- Dowell, Frances O'Roark. Dovey Coe. (PZ 7 .D73 Do 2001)
When accused of murder in her North Carolina mountain town in 1928, Dovey Coe, a strong-willed twelve-year-old girl, comes to a new understanding of others, including her deaf brother.
- Emert, Phyllis Raybin. Hearing-Ear Dogs. (PZ 10 .E48 He 1985)
Discusses the history, training, uses, and breeds of dogs to work with the deaf.

- Fain, Kathleen. Handsigns: a Language Alphabet. (PZ 10 .F14 Ha 1993)
Presents an animal for each letter of the alphabet, accompanied by the corresponding sign for that letter in American Sign Language.
- Ferris, Jean. Of Sound Mind. (PZ 7 .F4174 Of 2004)
Tired of interpreting for his deaf family and resentful of their reliance on him, high school senior Theo finds support and understanding from Ivy, a new student who also has a deaf parent.
- Kent, Deborah. American Sign Language. (PZ 10 .K46 Am 2003)
Explores the history of American Sign Language and deaf culture, including ongoing controversies within the deaf community today.
- Lakin, Patricia. Dad and Me in the Morning. (PZ 7 .L1586 Da 1994)
A deaf boy and his father share a special time as they watch the sun rise at the beach.
- Lee, Jeanne M. Silent Lotus. (PZ 7 .L51252 Si 1994)
Although she cannot speak or hear, a young Khmer girl trains as a court dancer and becomes eloquent in dancing out the legends of the gods.
- Matlin, Marlee. Deaf Child Crossing. (PZ 7 .M44 De 2004)
Despite the fact that Megan is deaf and Cindy can hear, the two girls become friends when Cindy moves into Megan's neighborhood, but when they go away to camp together, their friendship is put to the test.
- Millman, Isaac. Moses Goes to a Concert. (PZ 7 .M63954 Mo 1998)
A children's picture book in which a class of deaf children visit the orchestra and "hear" a concert. Includes sign language.
- Millman, Isaac. Moses Goes to School. (PZ 7 .M63954 Mo 2000)
Moses and his friends enjoy the first day of school at their special school for the deaf and hard of hearing, where they use sign language to talk to each other.
- Millman, Isaac. Moses Goes to the Circus. (PZ 7 .M63954 Mo 2003)
Moses, who is deaf, has a good time with his family at the circus, where they communicate using sign language. Includes illustrations of some of the signs they use.
- Millman, Isaac. Moses Sees a Play. (PZ 7 .M63954 Mo 2004)
Moses and his classmates, who are deaf or hard of hearing, attend a play at their school, and Moses makes a new friend from another class.
- Myers, Anna. Hoggee. (PZ 7 .M9814 Ho 2004)
Always overshadowed by his competitive older brother, especially in their work as mule drivers on the Erie Canal, fourteen-year-old Howard finally finds the courage to pursue his dreams of becoming an educator after he learns about sign language and teaches it to his deaf friend in nineteenth-century New York State.
- Nichol, Barbara. Beethoven Lives Upstairs. (PZ 7 .N489 Be 1999)
The letters that a 10-year-old boy and his uncle exchange show how the boy's feelings for deaf Mr. Beethoven, the eccentric boarder that shares his house, change from anger and embarrassment to compassion and admiration.

Peterson, Jeanne Whitehouse. I Have a Sister—My Sister is Deaf. (PZ 7 .P48 lh 1977)
A young girl describes how her sister experiences everyday things.

Rankin, Laura. The Handmade Alphabet. (PZ 10 .R17 Ha 1996)
Presents the handshape of for each letter of the American manual alphabet accompanied by an object whose name begins with that letter.

Riggio, Anita. Secret Signs: Along the Underground Railroad. (PZ 7 .R44187 Se 2003)
When the barn used for hiding runaway slaves is burned to the ground, a deaf boy finds a unique way to pass along information about the next safe haven.

Riskind, Mary. Apple is My Sign. (PZ 7 .R493 Ap 1981)
A 10-year-old boy returns to his parents' apple farm for the holidays after his first term at a school for the deaf in Philadelphia in 1899.

Rorby, Ginny. Hurt Go Happy. (PZ 7 .R69 Hu 2007)
When 13-year-old Joey Willis, deaf since the age of six, meets Dr. Charles Mansell and his chimpanzee Sukari, who use sign language, her world blooms with possibilities but that of the chimp begins to narrow.

Seeger, Pete. The Deaf Musicians. (PZ 7 .S45153 De 2006)
Lee, a Jazz pianist, has to leave his band when he begins to lose his hearing, but he meets a deaf saxophone player in a sign language class and together they form a snazzy new band. 2007 winner of the Schneider Family Book Award for best American picture book depicting persons with disabilities.

Uhlberg, Myron. Dad, Jackie, and Me. (PZ 7 .F4174 Da 2005)
A boy and his deaf father in Brooklyn in 1947 share their enthusiasm for baseball and for the Dodgers' first baseman, Jackie Robinson.
