MVCC Women's Soccer Team Members Win All-**American Honors**

Three members of the 2004 women's soccer team at MVCC have been selected for All-American honors by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) or the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA).

Senior forward Sarin Cavallo of Sauguoit was named First Team NSCAA All-American, and Second Team NJCAA All-American. Cavallo recorded 32 goals and 23 assists for the Hawks this year. Among her other honors: Mountain Valley Conference Player of the Year, First Team All-Region III (NJCAA), and Offensive Player of the Year in both the NJCAA Region III and national Division III tournament.

Senior mid-fielder Sarah LaReaux of Utica was selected for the NJCAA All-American Second Team, and the NJCAA All-Region III First Team. LaReaux recorded 17 goals and 10 assists for the Hawks.

Senior defender Emily Galiulo of Utica was named to the NSCAA All-American Second Team, as well as the All-Region III team and the MVP on defense in the NJCAA Region III tournament, and the All-Tournament Team in the NJCAA National Championship Tournament.

The MVCC Hawks, defending 2003 NJCAA national champions, compiled a 19-3 record during in fall competition. They finished second in the nation last month in the NJCAA's Division III, returning to the national championship game and losing on penalty kicks after a title game which went scoreless in regulation time and two overtimes. The Hawks are coached by Steve Senior, assisted by Jim Price of Waterville.
