MVCC, Griffiss Institute and Rome Lab Sponsor Summer Cybersecurity Program

MVCC and the Griffiss Information Assurance Institute, in collaboration with the Air Force Research Laboratory, will again offer a High School Cybersecurity Program to selected high school juniors and senior students. The opportunity is being made possible through the combined efforts of Congressman Sherwood Boehlert and Dr. Kamal Jabbour of the Air Force Research Laboratory. Students who live in the 23rd, 24th, and 25th Congressional Districts are eligible to participate.

The residential program is scheduled for August 14-19, 2005. Classes and laboratory experiences, taught by Cybersecurity experts, will be held at the Rome Campus. Topics will include areas such as legal issues and security policy, computer security, cryptography, steganography, digital forensics, network security, and wireless security.

Residence hall accommodations with 24-hour adult supervision are included in the program. The total cost has been set at \$375 per student. The fee covers tuition, room, meals, books, and computer access. Students will be responsible for their own transportation to and from the residence hall at the beginning and end of the week, and for any personal items needed. Federal funding covers all other expenses.
