

New and improved at the libraries: LibGuides

Over the summer and during the beginning of the fall semester, the librarians at MVCC were busy introducing a new service which is part of the green campus initiative and will benefit faculty, staff, and students, including distance learners.

LibGuides are designed to be a onestop shopping place for student research. LibGuides are wikis to which librarians have accounts, so that they can work on them from any computer. They use a Word-based text editor, with no need to know HTML or a program like Dreamweaver or FrontPage.

This allows new information to be added in a timely fashion and updates and new guides to be added quickly. They are flexible enough to allow links to PowerPoint presentations, streaming videos, slide shows, podcasts, and other media to be added.

Our LibGuides contain links to web sites, subject-appropriate journal databases, the Libraries' online catalog, the new interlibrary loan service, and our online reference services (Meebo and Ask Us 24/7).

They also include lists of reference and other books, audiovisual materials when

appropriate, call numbers for browsing in the stacks, suggested subject headings that can be copied and pasted into search boxes, citation help, related guides, and other resources. In addition, an instructor with an assignment requiring library research can request that his or her assignment or web page be posted on the appropriate LibGuide on a "Course pages" tab. Students who have used our LibGuides say the information is intuitively arranged and easy to use.

To access them, go to the Libraries' home page: www.mvcc.edu/academics/library/ Under "Find Research Tools" click on Subject Guides. Or go directly to: http://mvcc.libguides.com/ Once there you will see a center box labeled "Browse by Subject."

The guides in this category take the place of what used to be our Quick Reference Guides. In a box on the right-hand side of the screen, labeled "How to... Guides," you will find all our instructional handouts, including some from our Web Wednesday presentations.

In the boxes on the left-hand side of the screen, you will find handouts on writing and citations, and a link to our many subject bibliographies and webliographies. Not sure which box to look in? Use the search box to do a keyword search for a particular LibGuide, or browse all the LibGuides (currently 143!). Of particular interest to faculty is the Education (College) LibGuide, which contains books and web sites on "Hot Topics in College Education."

The LibGuides are not housed on the college's server, so if the MVCC Libraries web site is unavailable, users can still access the Libraries' resources by going directly to the MVCC LibGuides home page at http://mvcc.libguides.com/Many SUNY colleges are switching to LibGuides. Richardson to play for St John's University

MVCCC senior Kyle Richardson signed a letter of intent to play Division I baseball and study pre-med at St. John's University on Long Island after he graduates in May.

Richardson was a standout for the Hawks last season, earning MVP honors in the Mountain Valley Conference. In the Hawks' 37 games in which he played, Richardson's batting average was .419 with 124 at-bats. He had 52 hits of which nine were doubles and five were triples for 23 RBIs. He tied MVCC's record for hits in a season, and Warren expects him to be a preseason NJCAA All-American in the spring.

"It's what I've been thinking about doing since the beginning of high school," said Richardson in a recent interview. The 2008 Rome Free Academy graduate will receive a full scholarship to St. John's University. "I ended up being what they needed – a speed guy in the outfield and a leadoff-type guy – so it worked out."

While the 5-foot-8, 165-pound Richardson has pitched for MVCC as well as RFA, St. John's coach Ed Blankmeyer recruited him as an outfielder.

Binghamton University and Division III's Ithaca College also were in the running.

Richardson is carrying a 4.0 cumulative grade-point average as a sports medicine student at MVCC, and he plans to study biology with a pre-med focus at St. John's.

"I think (St. John's) liked the total package," said Dave Warren, MVCC baseball coach. "Kyle's just a class act. He's a great student and a phenomenal athlete. He's the best all-around player I've ever coached; you're lucky to get a Kyle Richardson once in a lifetime."

"He's very special, and not just as a baseball player. I'm proud of him, of everything he's done and everything he's going to do. This was his dream, to play Division I baseball, and I think he will have a shot at getting drafted some day. He'll be playing in a premier program, and with his athleticism and speed and character, I'd be surprised if he didn't play some kind of professional baseball somewhere."

After his final season at MVCC, Richardson will play for Little Falls in the New York Collegiate Baseball League.
