EMAIL: Your student email, which is the first letter of your first name with your last name, then the day of your birth (Example: `jd0e07@student.mvcc.edu`).

USERNAME: Your username (Example: `jd0e07`).

PASSWORD: The password you use to check your email and log on to the computers (by default it's the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number).

DOMAIN: `mvcclabs.edu`

EXCHANGE SERVER: `studentmail.mvcc.edu`

Accessibility Resources Office: Provides assistance campus-wide for students with physical, emotional, and/or learning disabilities.

Admissions: This is where you can find general information about the College, file your application, and request college catalogs, brochures, and individual campus visits.

Adult Learner Services: Assists students who are 25 or older.

Advisement/Assessment and Testing Center: Here, you can learn about Advisement, which helps with course selection and scheduling. You also can schedule your Assessment Test, which helps ensure appropriate course placement.

Art Department: This academic department houses programs and courses in the visual and studio arts.

Athletics, Physical Education and Recreation Department: This academic department offers programs in physical education and recreation, as well as the The Hawks, MVCC's diverse sports for men and women. Learn more at gomvhawks.com.

Business, Cybersecurity, and Computer Sciences Department: This academic department offers programs in Accounting, Business Information, Cybersecurity, Computer Sciences, Entrepreneurship, and Web Development and Information Design.

Career Services: Learn about the services offered to students looking to enter the job market upon graduation.

College Community Connection: Connects MVCC students with local agencies that can help them reach their goals.

Counseling Office: Assists students with the many challenges associated with the adjustment to college life.

Center for Corporate and Community Education: Offers an array of short-term, non-credit courses. Visit their table to learn about their offerings.

College Works: A collaborative project with The Arc, Oneida-Lewis Chapter of the statewide NYSARC, Inc., for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Cultural Series/Events: Brings world-class lectures, concerts, comedy, theatre, and more to the community.

Education and Language Studies Department: This academic department offers courses in developmental studies, education, foreign languages, and English as a Second Language.

Financial Aid/Scholarships: MVCC offers many scholarships for its students, and most students use financial aid to fund their education. This table has information about both.

Health Center: Staffed by a full-time registered nurse. Stop by to learn about the paperwork needed to be a matriculated student.

Health Professions Department: This academic department offers programs in rapidly growing medical professions, including Surgical Technology, Nursing, Health Information Technology, Respiratory Care, and Radiologic Technology.

Hospitality Department: This academic area offers programs in Culinary Arts Management, Food Service Administration, and Hotel Technology: Meeting Services Management.

Humanities Department: This academic department offers courses in English, history, and the humanities, which are required to fulfill general education requirements. It also provides support to students in General Studies, Social Sciences & Humanities, International Studies, and Theater.

Learning Commons: Offers free peer and professional tutoring in a variety of subjects, Completion Coaches, and academic support.

LGBTQ Resources: MVCC is a welcoming, diverse learning community and strives to encourage understanding and interaction among all types of students, faculty, and staff.

Mathematics and Natural Sciences Department: This academic department offers programs in the areas of mathematics and natural sciences, including Biology, Chemical Technology, Chemistry, and Nutrition and Dietetics.

Physical Sciences, Engineering and Applied Technologies Department: This academic department offers programs in Physics, Geology, Engineering, and Remotely Piloted Aircraft Systems, as well as applied technologies like Welding.

Public Safety: Provides protection and service to the campus community 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and is staffed by sworn law enforcement officers designated as Peace Officers, as well as Campus Safety Officers.

Residence Life: MVCC operates five on-campus residence halls on the Utica Campus. Stop by the table to learn about the dorms, and request a tour while you're here.

Student Engagement and Outreach: Learn about MVCC's wide variety of clubs and organizations for student involvement.

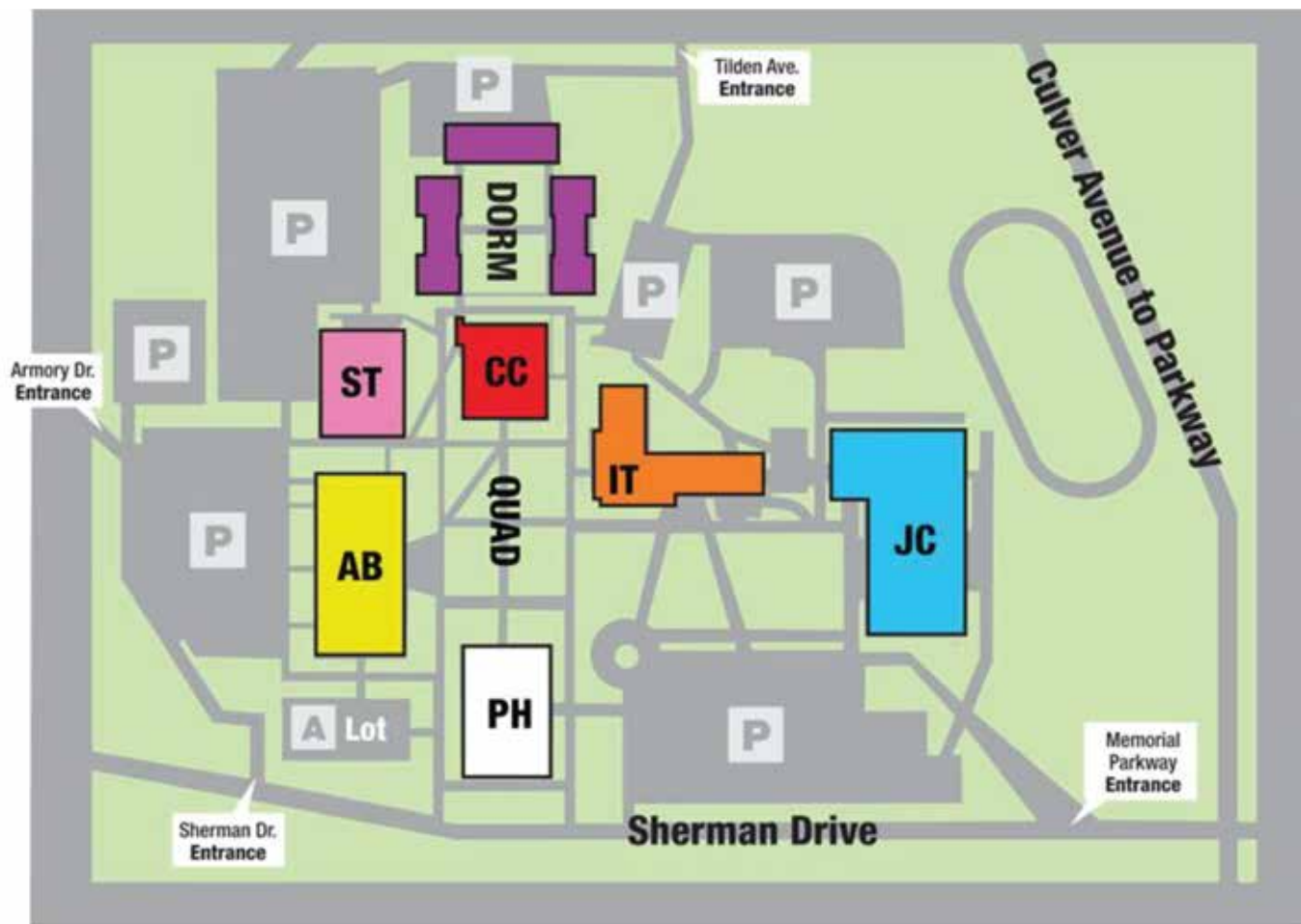
University Partners and Transfer Center: This office assists students in their transfer journey once they complete their studies at MVCC. Stop by to learn about our university partners!
