TIPS FOR SUCCESS

Take control of your own education.

- Think of yourself as an independent learner.

Be assertive.

- Ask for help when you need it.
- Speak up in class & ask questions.

Attending classes regularly matters!

- Not attending classes could cost you more than just your grades.
- Even Online! Just logging in to your course may not be enough.

Find a routine early and stick to it!

- Plan ahead.
- Make your school work a priority.
- Keep track of your deadlines and DON'T miss them.

Read and refer back to your course Syllabus often.

- This is your road map for each course.
- It tells you critical information like due dates, class policies, and how you will be graded.
- Keep your syllabus! It could help you later in life prove the things you learned.

Be resilient!

- Don't drop any course too quickly.
- Talk over any potential schedule changes with your SSA so you understand how it could impact you.
- Think beyond the moment that's frustrating you.

Stay connected!

- Talk to your instructors outside of class.
- Get to know your SSA and other support services on campus.
- Join a club/other campus organization.
- Check your MVCC email daily.

Set goals for yourself.

- Set a goal for a test, class, semester, GPA, to join a club, no matter what it is, set one and achieve it!

Find a mentor/coach/cheerleader.

- Having a "go-to" person on campus who you can trust and talk with is critical to your success.
- We think your SSA is a good place to start!

Use campus support services.

- There are lots of offices to help you in so many ways, not just with your academics.

The Academic Advantage Pack was developed to provide a more affordable and convenient way for students to get their course materials each term.

HOW IT WORKS

1. Register for classes

Upon registering for courses, you will be automatically enrolled in the program, and the bookstore will begin preparing you 35-50% on the cost of course materials!

2. Verify your order

Starting 30 days before the first day of classes, you will receive an email to verify your order and select how you would like to receive your course materials. You will also be able to verify your order through the bookstore website and through QR codes available at the bookstore.

3. Receive your textbooks

An email notification will be sent when your order is ready for pickup or when it ships. Your digital materials will be delivered for your courses(s) within Brightspace.

MVCC recommends students have the following devices to successfully complete your classes:

Active cell phone:

- The College will call and text students to share important information.
- MVCC uses two-factor authentication to verify it's you every time you log into a college system. MyMV, Brightspace, your email, etc.
- **NOT recommended for online classes.**

A computer of your choice:

- Some majors have recommendations on what type of computer to have.
- A general guideline is a Windows based PC (laptop or desktop).
 - Talk with your SSA to find out more.
- There are computer labs on campus for students to use!

Here's a few tips for success:

- Microsoft offers free Office 365 access to students!

- Some of your courses may use electronic books and outside software.

ADVISEMENT AT MVCC

MVCC has a dual advisement system. Students receive the best of both worlds by being connected to the college with their Student Support Advisor and their Faculty Advisor. Each role is explained in more detail below.

Student Support Advisors (SSAs) Assigned based upon your selected major, associated school, and last name.

- Serves as your one point of contact with the college regarding your needs as a student.
- Provides academic guidance, support, and registration assistance.
- Communicates important information to you via text and email throughout each semester.
- Assists with academic planning to meet your educational goals including discussions about transferring or entering the workforce. Provides appropriate referrals to offices based on your needs.

Faculty Advisors

- Assigned based upon your selected major.
- Provides guidance regarding academic electives, internship opportunities, career paths, and transfer schools.
- Provides appropriate referrals to offices based on your needs.

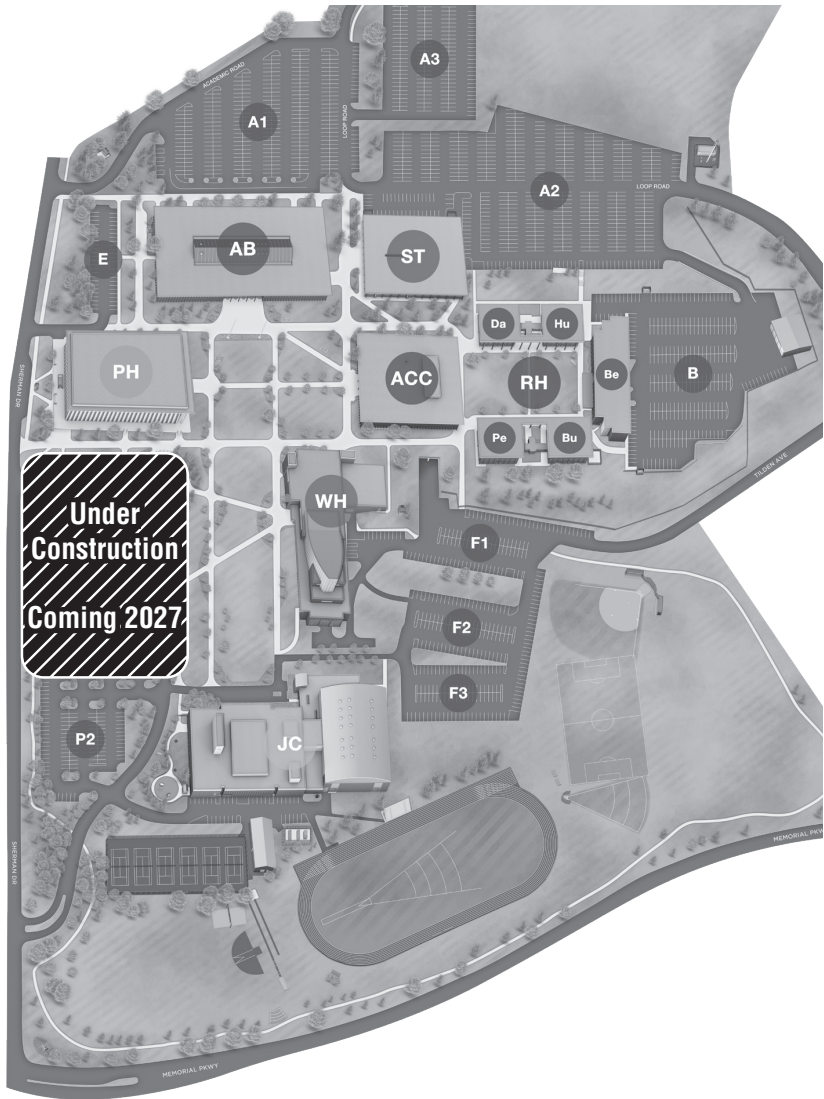

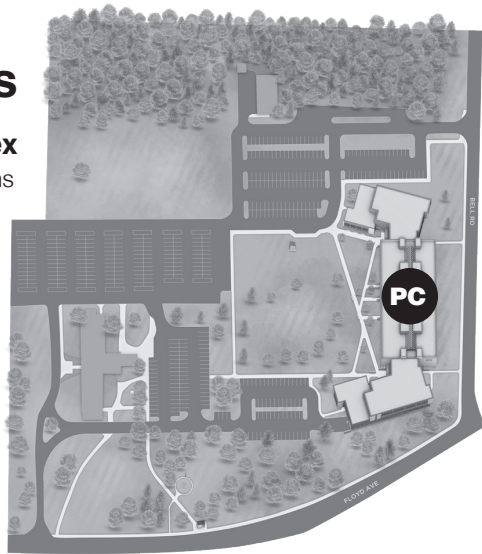

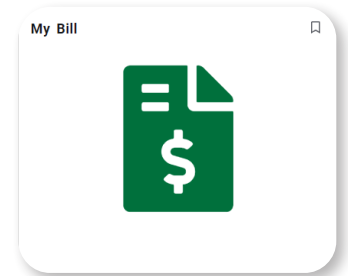

PAYING YOUR BILL



Whether you are using Financial Aid or paying the bill on your own, you will need to complete the following steps by the due date to ensure that you do not lose your schedule:

1. Log into MyMV (using your MVCC student email credentials)
2. Find the My Bill card and click on it (icon shown to the right)
3. Select the term for the semester you are enrolled in (ex: Fall 2026)
4. Follow steps below:



ALL STUDENTS:

1. Must complete the Financial Responsibility Form **before** 4:00pm EST on August 6th, 2026 (payment due date)
2. Click on the linked text "Financial Responsibility form" in the blue box to complete the form

 To save your schedule: 1. Complete your [Financial Responsibility form](#). 2. Make [payment arrangements](#) for any remaining balance on your account (if greater than \$0) by the payment due date. 

STUDENTS WITH A BALANCE DUE

Complete the steps above for all students first.

In Person or By Mail

- Payment must be made in FULL (payment plans are available through on-line payment)
- Cash, credit, or checks made out to Mohawk Valley Community College accepted.

 - Check payments should include student name and M# (student ID#) on memo line
- International wire transfer is available

Pay by phone

- Payment must be made in FULL (payment plans are available through on-line payment)
- Business Office: 315-792-5475
- Recommended students/payers do not wait until last minute for this method

Pay Online

- Log into MyMV, click the MyBill card
- \$35 enrollment fee is charged each semester for on-line payment.
- \$30 returned payment fee if funds are unavailable.
- Payment plans
 - Automatic payments accepted from checking, saving, credit, or debit cards
 - Students must create their account first and then they can add an authorized payer

- Books & Required Materials:**
 - Wait for your email from the bookstore regarding the Academic Advantage Pack.
 - Students are automatically opted into this program.
 - Required supplies are NOT a part of the fees charged. (book bundle fee on your bill)

- Financial Aid:**
 - Submit the 2026-2027 Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - Complete the New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP).
 - Speak with Financial Aid if you have any additional questions.

- Certificate of Residency:**

This is required for students who live outside of Oneida County.

 - Completed Certificate of Residence paperwork must be submitted to the Business office.

- Health Form & Immunization Records:**
 - Submit your Health Form and Immunization (MMR) records. (if registered for 6 or more credits in person)

- Living on Campus:**
 - If on-campus housing was not selected on your application, connect with the Admissions to update your application for on-campus housing.
 - Complete the Housing Information & Preference Form and submit the \$100 damage/security deposit.
 - Secure payment prior to scheduled check-in date.

- Payment due date for the Fall 2026 semester is August 6, 2026**
 - **YOUR SCHEDULE WILL BE CANCELED after 4 p.m. on this day if your bill is not paid.**
 - Bills should be available to you through your MyMV account. Look for the MyBill tile.

If using financial aid:

 1. It may take a day or two for your aid to be placed on your account.
 2. Even if financial aid is covering your entire bill, you still need to complete the Financial Responsibility Form found in MyBill in your MyMV account.

- Clifton Strengths:**
 - Check your MVCC email 3 to 4 days before the start of classes for an email from support@mail.gallup.com with the subject line “Complete your Clifton Strengths Survey for CF 100”
 - If you have a reading disability and need to take the Clifton Strengths assessment without a response timer follow the directions on screen to connect with Gallup’s support team.

- Student ID and Parking Permit:**
 - To receive your parking permit, please bring a valid Driver’s License and current vehicle registration.
 - Visit Public Safety on the Utica Campus, AB 106, or visit Student Services on the Rome campus, PC 130.

- Transcripts:**
 - Submit Official Transcripts (sent directly to MVCC by the institution) for any college/university you have attended to the Admissions Office.
 - Advanced Placement (AP) scores are released in early July and must be requested from CollegeBoard.
 - Evaluation of transcripts takes time once they are submitted.
 - It’s important to let your SSA know if you are expecting any credit you haven’t previously discussed.
