- (A) GE Mathematics: Choose from MA 108, MA 110, or any higher course except MA 171 and MA 172 (based on placement test).
- (B) Foreign Language: Students must take 6 credits of the same language; FL, FR, GR, IT, or SP
- (C) Core GE Natural Science: Students can choose from: BI 103, BI 105, BI 141, BI 216i, CH 101, CH 111, CH 120, CH 131, CH 141, GL 100, GL 101, GL 102, PH 105, PH 112, PH 141, PH 151, OH 261 or WE 101
- (D) Restricted Elective: Students need to take 3 classes (9 credits) of any 200-level course with a prefix of EN, HU, or HI or Foreign Language not already within the curriculum
- (E) Student can choose one of the following: SA 300m HU 280 or HU 295
- (1) The University at Albany does not accept transfer credit for College Foundations Seminar courses.
- (2) This course is suggested because it meets a requirement for the major at UAlbany upon transfer.
- (3) Students must earn a grade of C or higher.
- (4) Either PY 204 or SO 202 will meet the requirement at UAlbany for the Psychology or Sociology Elective.
- (5) Students must select from: ACOM 371, AENG/AWSS 362, APhi 326, APSY 327, APSY 329, APSY 333, APSY 338, APSY 340, ASOC 362, ASOC 384, ECPY 410, ETL 404, ETL 406, EPSY 411, HSPH 341, HSPH 342, HSPH 343, or RCRJ 308.
- (6) Students pursuing concentrations in Counseling Psychology, Education Psychology, or Special Education must take EPSY 390. Students pursuing the Peer Assistance and Leadership concentration must take ECPY 497.
- (7) Students will select one of the following Concentrations: Counseling Psychology, Educational Psychology, Special Education, or Peer Assistance and Leadership.
- (8) All students must complete the DASA training. It is recommended that this be completed before the field-based learning experience.
- (9) Students may not minor in Educational Studies.

A transfer student admitted to the University at Albany who has completed his/her A.A. or A.S. degree will be given credit for meeting SUNY's General Education requirements.

Transfer students are expected to apply for admission to the program when applying for admissions to UAlbany. For Fall admissions, applications must be received by July 1<sup>st</sup>. Admission criteria for the program are as follows:

- Student must have already completed 24 credits (sophomore status);
- Cumulative GPA must be 3.00 or higher;
- APSY 101, ASOC 115, and EPSY 200 (or their transfer equivalents) must be completed with a minimum grade of C or better;
- Students must submit a Written Statement clearly stating their reasons for pursuing the major.

For students who have not completed the above admissions criteria, they may declare their intentions to pursue the major but will not be formally admitted until they have completed all criteria.
