- (A) Foreign Language: Students must take 6 credits of the same language: FL, FR, GR, IT, or SP
 (B) GE Social Science: Choose two courses from the following: AN 101, BM 101, GE 101, PS 101, PY 101, or SO 101.
 (C) General Education: Students can choose from any course from the MVCC General Education Course list not already in the curriculum
 (D) Core GE Natural Science: Students can choose from: BI 103, BI 105, BI 141, BI 216t, CH 101, CH 111, CH 120, CH 131, CH 141, GL 100, GL 101, GL 102, PH 106, PH 112, PH 141, PH 151, OH 261 or WE 101
 (E) Restricted Elective: Students need to take 3 classes (9 credits) of any 200-level course with a prefix of EN, HU, or HI or Foreign Language not already within the curriculum
 (F) Student can choose one of the following: SA 300m HU 280 or HU 295
 (1) The University at Albany does not accept transfer credit for College Foundations Seminar courses.
 (2) This course is suggested because it meets a requirement for the major at UAlbany upon transfer.
 (3) ASOC 220 and ASOC 235 are restricted to A-E grading after matriculation at UAlbany and students must earn a grade of C or better.
 (4) Topics Seminar must be at the 400-level.
 (5) 18 credits must be at the 300-level or above.

A transfer student admitted to the University at Albany who has completed his/her A.A. or A.S. degree will be given credit for meeting SUNY's General Education requirements. Transfer students who plan to major in Sociology but have not completed ASOC 220 or ASOC 235 or their equivalents with grades of C or better may declare their intention to major in Sociology but will not be formally admitted to the major when they enter the University. Students who declare their intention to major in Sociology will be advised by the Sociology Department. Upon successful completion of the two courses with a grade of C or better in each, students will be admitted to the major. Most entering transfer students have completed ASOC 115 (Introduction to Sociology). Those who have not taken ASOC 115 must take it their first semester. Students to whom this applies may take ASOC 115, ASOC 220, and ASOC 235 concurrently during their first semester.
