(3)ASOC 220 and ASOC 235 are restricted to A-E grading after matriculation at UAlbany and students must earn a grade of C or better.

(4)Students must select from: ASOC/RCRJ 203, ASOC 283, ASOC 380, ASOC 382, ASOC 385, with permission one of ASOC 490, ASOC 497, or ASOC 498.

A transfer student admitted to the University at Albany who has completed his/her A.A.S. degree will need to complete all remaining SUNY General Education Requirements prior to degree completion.

Transfer students who plan to major in Sociology but have not completed ASOC 220 or ASOC 235 or their equivalents with grades of C or better may declare their intention to major in Sociology but will not be formally admitted to the major when they enter the University. Students who declare their intention to major in Sociology will be advised by the Sociology Department. Upon successful completion of the two courses with a grade of C or better in each, students will be admitted to the major. Most entering transfer students have completed ASOC 115 (Introduction to Sociology). Those who have not taken ASOC 115 must take it their first semester. Students to whom this applies may take ASOC 115, ASOC 220, and ASOC 235 concurrently during their first semester.
