(1)The University at Albany does not accept transfer credit for College Foundations Seminar courses.

(2)MVCC students are encouraged to take MA 110 over MA 108 to meet a major requirement upon transfer.

(3)This course is suggested because it meets a requirement for the major at UAlbany upon transfer.

(4)Students must take one of the following: ABIO 102, ABIO 117, ABIO 130, AANT 211, AANT 312, or AANT 319.

(5)Students must earn a grade of C (or S) or higher in these courses.

(6)Students must select a course of personal interest that specifically addresses issues facing a gender, ethnic, racial, or religious group that is different from the student's own background. Students are encouraged to discuss selecting a course with their advisor.

A transfer student admitted to the University at Albany who has completed his/her A.A.S. degree will need to complete all remaining SUNY General Education Requirements prior to degree completion.

Transfer students interested in the social welfare major must complete an application process. Admission to the program is competitive. Transfer students who will have completed 56 credits should apply during the spring of the year for which they are seeking Fall admission.
