

Transfer Articulation Agreement Between Nazareth College of Rochester And Mohawk Valley Community College

This document establishes a formal transfer agreement between Nazareth College of Rochester and Mohawk Valley Community College.

Objectives

To enter into an agreement that will encourage and allow transfer of students from Mohawk Valley Community College to the following School of Management programs at Nazareth College:

The objectives of this agreement are:

- 1. To promote an efficient transition of highly qualified transfer students from Mohawk Valley Community College to Nazareth College of Rochester.
- 2. To provide specific information for students who wish to transfer to Nazareth College of Rochester to pursue a baccalaureate degree.
- 3. To provide a clear and systematic procedure for the exchange of information relating to transfer from Mohawk Valley Community College to Nazareth College of Rochester.

Program

Full junior standing will be granted for transfer students in the programs cited in this agreement.

Terms

The conditions under which transfer will be accomplished include:

- 1. Students must successfully complete one of the Mohawk Valley Community College programs cited before entering Nazareth College of Rochester Bachelor of Science program.
- 2. Students will follow the application procedure for transfer students as outlined in the Nazareth College of Rochester current undergraduate catalog. Transfer students must complete and file the Transfer Application for Undergraduate Admission prior to **April 1 for fall semester entry** and **November 1 for spring semester entry**.

- 3. Students must maintain a satisfactory academic record at Mohawk Valley Community College, one indicating promise of completing Nazareth College of Rochester Bachelor of Science program. The record should include a minimum GPA of 2.5.
- 4. There is a 60 credit hour limit on the amount of eligible transfer credit granted.
- 5. Although transfer credit cannot be granted for physical education courses, their successful completion at Mohawk Valley Community College fulfills the physical education requirements at Nazareth College of Rochester.
- 6. Courses with grades of "C" or better will be accepted for transfer credit.
- 7. The exact content of a student's degree program at Nazareth College of Rochester will depend upon the specific courses taken as part of their Mohawk Valley Community College's program.
- 8. Those students who anticipate transfer to Nazareth College of Rochester should seek advisement from their Mohawk Valley Community College faculty advisor, or transfer advisor in determining which courses will best satisfy the degree requirements at Nazareth College of Rochester.
- 9. The attached **addendum A** includes an semester-by-semester advising guide to complete the Mohawk Valley Community College program and Bachelor of Science degree program at Nazareth College of Rochester. **Addendum B** includes an articulation agreement chart indicating which Mohawk Valley Community College courses will satisfy Nazareth College of Rochester core and major requirements.

Other Programs

Transfer opportunities may exist in programs not listed in the agreement. Students enrolled in those programs who have an interest in transfer are encouraged to apply. These applications will be handled on an individual basis.

Review and Revision

- 1. This agreement will be reviewed every three years or when substantial changes are made in the curriculum on either campus. At the request of either party, a review of the Transfer Articulation Agreement will be conducted by both institutions. The course selection included in this articulation may be subject to change as new requirements are established for majors. Both institutions assume a good faith effort to continually update each college on any changes to programs and requirements. This joint effort on the part of both institutions is to help transfer students maximize their transferability.
- 2. Nazareth College of Rochester agrees to regularly inform Mohawk Valley Community College of the progress of its graduates who transfer under the auspices of the Transfer Articulation Agreement.
