Additional Requirements:

The Inclusive Education degree program is a dual certification program comprised of the Inclusive Adolescence Education major and a content area major. The program results in certification in Adolescence Education (grades 7-12) in the chosen content area with Middle School Extension (grades 5-6) and Students with Disabilities (grades 7-12) Generalist. This program is designed to prepare candidates to teach in one of the following disciplines at the middle and adolescence levels (grades 5-12): American Studies, Biology, Chemical Education, English, French, History, Mathematics, Physics, or Spanish. In addition, candidates earn certification to teach students with disabilities in grades 7-12 as a Generalist. A Generalist is certified for employment as a supporting teacher for students with disabilities in content areas other than the candidate's major area of study.

Students should choose one content area major and complete as many recommended courses below as needed to fulfill program elective requirements. The second major may require candidates to complete more than the minimum 120 credits required for degree completion. Please contact the Office of Transfer Admissions at St. John Fisher College for advisement regarding transfer courses for chosen content area.

NOTE: Grade of C or higher required in all courses used toward Education major and NYS Content Core required by St. John Fisher College. Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher required for continuation at SJFC. Students must complete at least half of their intended major at Fisher. Total credits remaining at Fisher for a student who completes the above prescribed coursework depends upon major chosen to be combined with Adolescence Inclusive Education program.
